National non-profit organization that provides free professional support services to anyone affected by cancer. Several financial assistance programs through CancerCare are available, including:

- **Komen Treatment Assistance Fund:** Limited financial assistance for breast cancer patients for transportation to and from treatment; lymphedema care and supplies; oral pain and anti-nausea medication; oral chemotherapy/hormone therapy; child care/elder care; palliative care and other home care; and durable medical equipment.
- **Touching Hearts Program:** Limited financial assistance for women with cancer for home care, childcare, transportation and pain medication.

Possible eligibility criteria for programs:

1. Women with all diagnoses
 2. Children with all diagnoses
 3. Men and women with metastatic melanoma (transportation only)
 4. Men, women and children with all diagnoses in New York City, Nassau, Suffolk, Westchester, Rockland, Dutchess, Putnam, Columbia, Greene, Orange, Ulster, Sullivan and Delaware Counties in New York State, New Jersey and Connecticut.

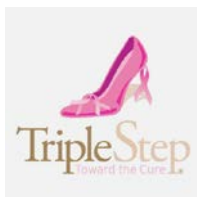
